As is well-known, the final issue of the year typically carries both the Presidential Address, delivered at the annual meeting in the spring, as well as summaries by all Krooss Prize finalists. Those of you able to attend the annual meeting in Detroit in March 2023 will have been spellbound by Dan Wadhvani's Presidential Address, which wove together strands of his rich historical entrepreneurship scholarship with threads of his own fascinating family story. The 2023 Krooss Prize was awarded to Adam Frost. Congratulations to Adam and both of the other shortlisted candidates.

Alongside the Krooss Prize summaries we are proud to present a very full suite of regular research articles.
